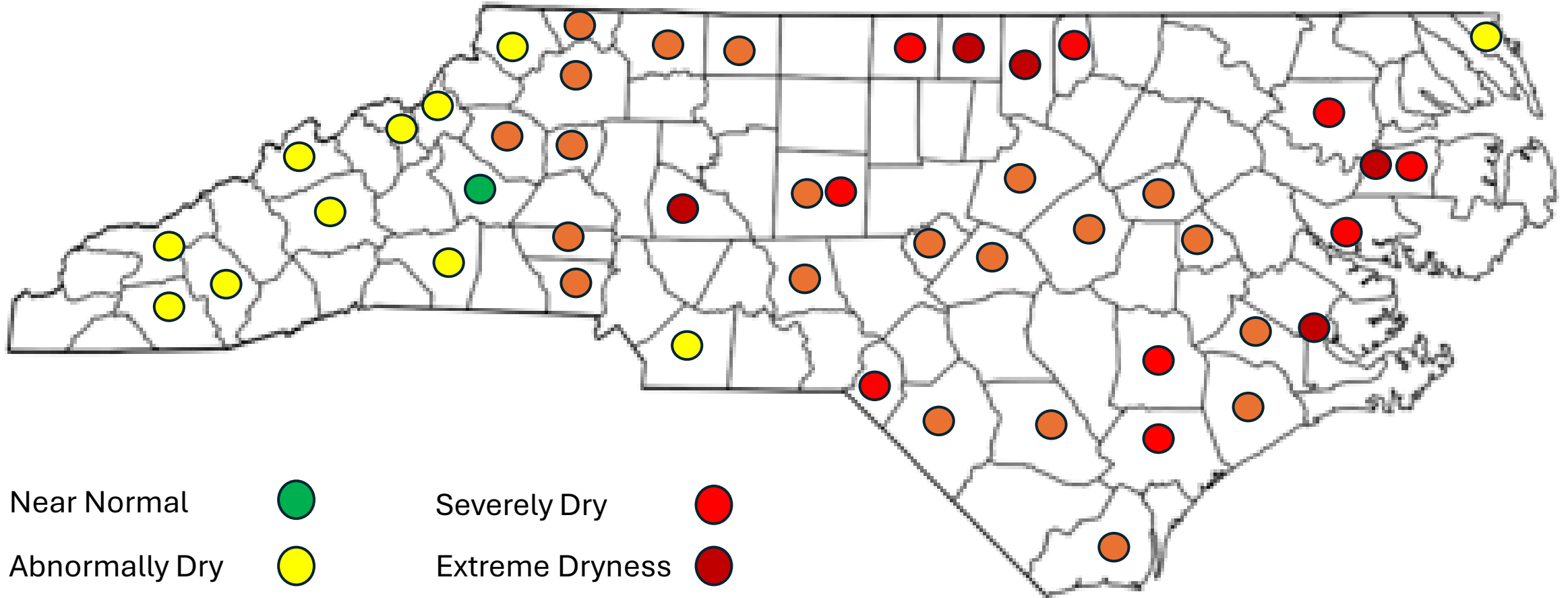

- July 2024
  - Abnormally dry in west
  - Easter 75% extremely dry
  - Carryover from June
    - Early planted crops affected most
- August-September
  - Portion of state saw 150-400% of normal.
  - Hurricane Helene

## Agriculture Impacts 2024-2025



- Winter 24-25
  - Intermittent dryness into November
  - March: dryness shift West to East
    - Delayed planting in some counties
- Spring/Summer
  - Temperate w/good moisture
  - Ended year with crops in good condition.

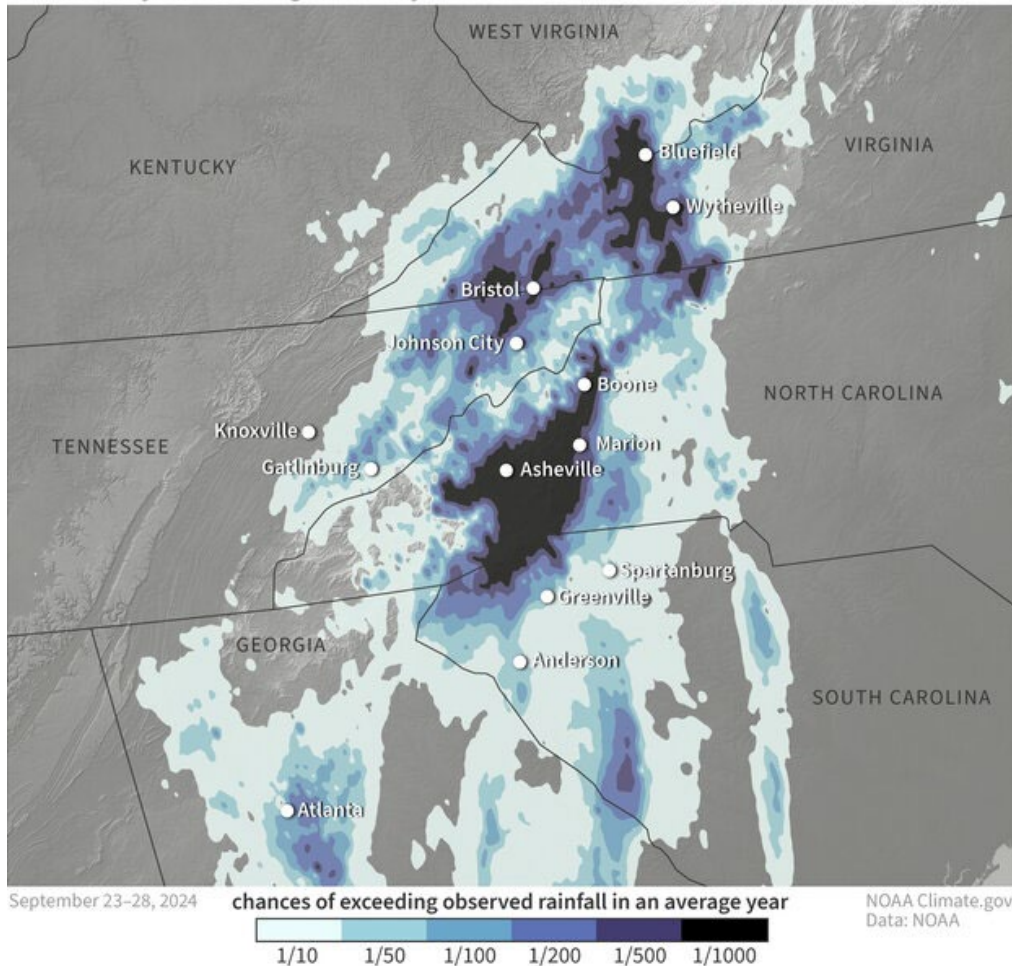






# DMAC 2024-25 Agriculture in a Nutshell
